

Jackpot Winners Suing Illinois Lottery As State Budget Impasse Blocks Payments

(CBS) — Big jackpot winners are suing the Illinois Lottery – because they haven't seen a penny of their prize money since there is no state budget yet.



It's the big winners who haven't been paid, the ones who won more than \$25,000 since July 1.

Zimmerman is the attorney representing lottery jackpot winners in a federal class action suit.

"The lottery winners are counting on that money," he said. "Some folks have taken out loans and are paying interest on loans with the anticipation that they will be receiving the lottery money."

Zimmerman says his clients want their money with interest.

One client, Rhonda Raschel, won \$50,000. Another, Danny Chasteen, won \$250,000

According to the Illinois Lottery website, the state currently owes about \$288 million to at least 29 people.

The Illinois Lottery spokesman said he could not comment on the lawsuit.

The state's comptroller, Leslie Munger, said that because the payments are not under a court order, Illinois cannot cut those lottery checks without a budget in place.
